Did You Know?

In the UK, there are around **1.25 million** young adults currently not in education, employment or training and FSA research tells us that they are less financially capable than their peers and are also more likely to be financially excluded.

The course is designed to help increase the confidence of those who support young people to become more financially capable. The core subject areas covered in the courses are:

- The psychology of young people and money
- Income, budgeting and banking
- Helping young people to understand and compare credit deals and options
- Debt Management – Knowing when, where and how to refer young people for money advice
- Skills to engage young people in financial matters
